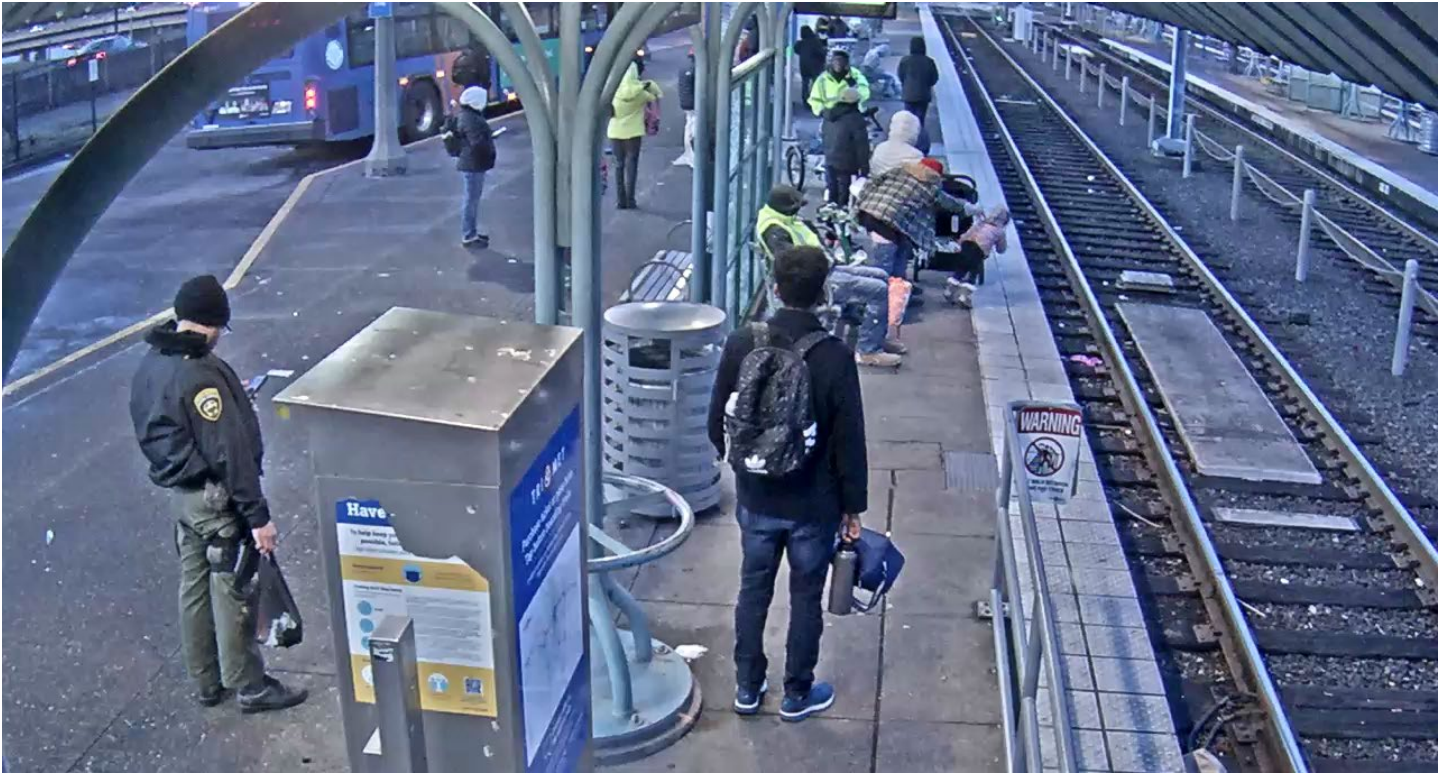

# Security Staffing Increases

Role	2022	2023
Transit Security Officers	101	160
Customer Safety Supervisors	37	46
Customer Safety Officers	42	80
Safety Response Team	48	60



# Transit Police Division

- Taskforce model led by Multnomah County Sheriff's Office
- 19 of 65 positions filled
- Strategic public safety missions
- Local law enforcement responds to serious incidents on TriMet

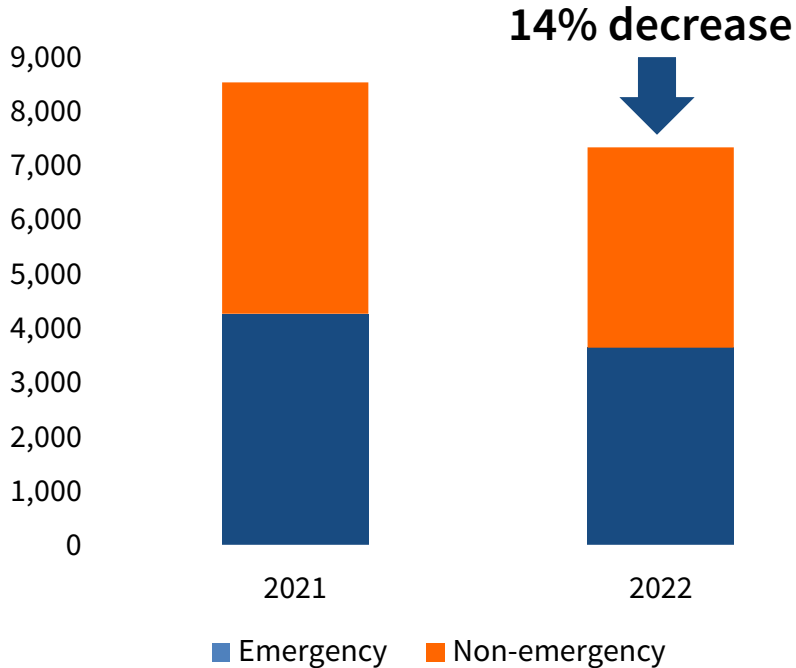


# Strategic Security Actions

Welfare Check – 17.2%

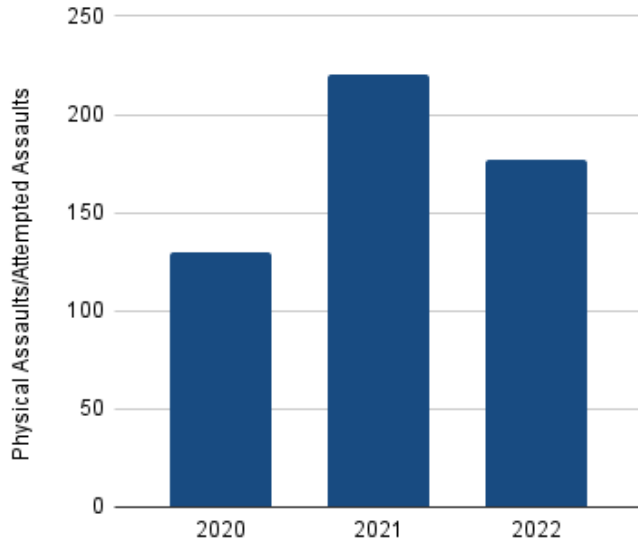
Suspicious Circumstance – 13.1%

Unwanted Person – 11.6%

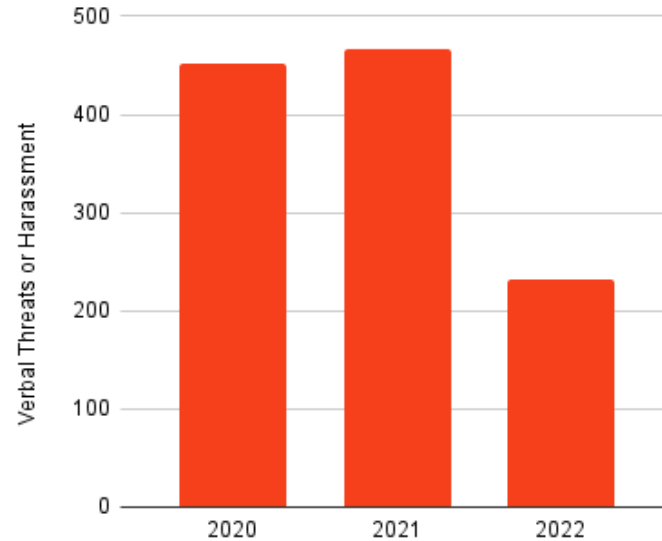
# Incidents Against Employees
